## Principal's Report

Dear Parents

A big welcome back to term 4.

We are so excited to have school procedures and operations stabilise at the moment, and I guess the best way to describe our current practice in that we are continuing with the processes and expectations that have been in place towards the end of term 3 with some slight changes following the relaxation of some guidelines.

### STAFFING

Miss Kara Sullivan will be on leave for the first six weeks of this term. Miss Sullivan provides release from face to face teaching for our staff as well as provides the relief for Mrs Thompson when she completes her Instructional leader work. We welcome Miss Sara Kozman to our school to undertake these duties in her absence.

### 2021

We are currently planning our staffing and class structures for 2021. It is important for the school to be as accurate as possible to ensure the structures we have in place to commence the year can be maintained and not need to be revised. It is important that parents keep us up to date with their intentions for 2021. To help with this, we ask that any Kindergarten enrolments for 2021 be submitted and finalised with the front office if you have not already completed the process as well as any families who may be moving on to other locations or schools please provide written confirmation to Mr Wynn as soon as your plans are definite. Your help and support on this matter is much appreciated.

### COVID-19 UPDATE

Information from the NSW Ministry of Health September 24

The following is information taken from the guidelines provided by the N.S.W. Department of Health:

- Schools should continue to exclude students and staff with even the mild symptoms of COVID-19 and encourage them to seek testing immediately. Parents of symptomatic children will need to provide evidence of a negative test result on their child's return to school.
- In the case of seasonal allergic rhinitis or other conditions that present similarly to COVID-19 and in the presence of continuing symptoms, the child will need a negative COVID-19 test result and a letter from a GP confirming that the child should be permitted to return to school.
- Non-essential adults should continue to be excluded from school.

Information from the Department of Education Advice for Families September 24

### School Attendance

Students should be at school unless:

- They have a medical certificate which states they are unable to return to school
- They are currently unwell
- Parents and carers are reminded not to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms
- NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested.
- Staff and students with flu-like symptoms need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom free before being permitted to return to school.
- Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test will not be permitted to return to school for a 10 day period. Additionally they must also be symptom free for at least three days before returning to school.

- Students who have seasonal allergic rhinitis or another condition that present similarly to flu-like symptoms are still required to get tested for COVID-19 and return a negative test result. Where their symptoms continue beyond 10 days, parents should provide documentation from their GP confirming their symptoms are typical for their condition. If the student develops new or changed symptoms they should get tested for COVID-19
- Schools will promote the regular washing of hands
- Students are not permitted to share food.
- All students should have their own water bottle at school
- Parents and carers are not allowed on the school site.
- Incursions can provide activities that support the delivery of the curriculum
- P&C meetings must be online only
- Parent and teacher meetings will be online unless involving a serious matter requiring face to face discussion

Thanks for your understanding and support of the school as we continue to implement these guidelines to protect the health and safety of our children, our staff, our families and our school community.

This week we will be considering solutions and possibilities concerning Kindergarten Orientation, our Year 6 Farewell and our School Presentation activities. As our ideas and plans come together, we will share with the appropriate audiences and seek feedback on those ideas as we plan forward.

We just like our students and parents, can feel frustrated and disappointed that things can not be as we would expect, but this can also be seen as an opportunity to try something different within the guidelines and procedures prescribed. As a school we will also be seeking to give as much clarity and forewarning of our actions with an understanding that things can change at any time.

The other frustration we also understand is the confusion that exists when we hear reports in the media that are not always accurate and we have knowledge of other schools' plans that may not be fully compliant with the expectations of the NSW Government and the Department of Education.

Please keep a look out for further updates.

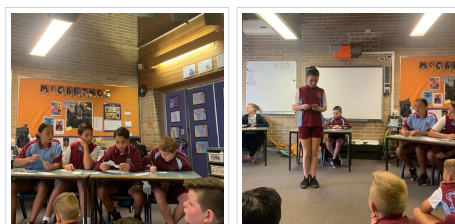
## Debating in Class McCartney

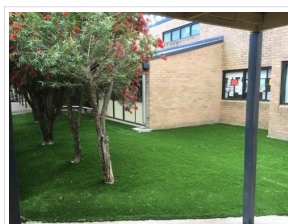
Moral of the story, there are places to run and in a high school hallway is definitely not one!

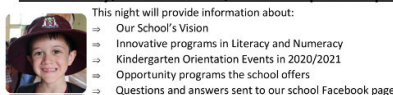
