FUN!

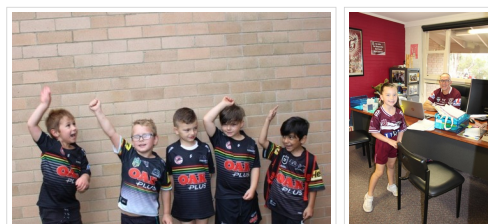

We are currently planning our staffing and class structures for 2021. It is important for the school to be as accurate as possible to ensure the structures we have in place to commence the year can be maintained and not need to be revised. It is important that parents keep us up to date with their intentions for 2021. To help with this, we ask that any Kindergarten enrolments for 2021 be submitted and finalised with the front office. If you have not already completed the process as well as any families who may be moving on to other locations or schools please provide written confirmation to Mr Wynn as soon as your plans are definite. Your help and support on this matter are much appreciated.

There have been some questions around the Department of Education's revised Non-Local Enrolment Policy. Please remember that any families currently enrolled at Cambridge Gardens PS who live in the Jordan Springs PS enrolment area are welcome to stay at Cambridge Gardens PS and any other siblings in these families are permitted to enrol at the school in future years. Other out of area families (those not living in the Cambridge Gardens PS or Jordan Springs PS catchment areas) with younger siblings will need to complete an out of area request. The Department of Education is permitting a phased and sensible approach to these requests with the last sibling in a family being permitted and with any further children the circumstances being taken into account. If you have any concerns or questions please give me a call to discuss.

TELEPHONES

Just to let you know the school has been having ongoing issues with both internal and external phone lines over the past two weeks. It has been incredibly frustrating with the faults being intermittent and inconsistent including phones ringing with seemingly no person on the incoming call, situations where one end of the call is fully operational whilst the other end is not, phone lines just ringing out and loud buzzing and interference during calls. We have further repairs occurring today and we hope that this will finally resolve these issues. We appreciate your understanding throughout this time and apologise for the inconvenience.

INCURSIONS

We are very excited to be able to host the upcoming incursions across our school. Please don't miss out as the final day for payment for the Stage 1 Wicked Weather and the Stage 2 and 3 Space incursion is the Friday October 30. Please also be aware that the following Friday November 6 is the final day

for payment for the KindiFarm incursion. Please make your payment as soon as possible to ensure all processes can be completed to enable your child's participation in these most valuable experiences as well as a bit of fun following our inability to provide excursions in 2020.

COVID-19 UPDATE

At this stage there have been no changes in the past two weeks that would alter our current operations.

We are currently planning our events for later in the year that will be significantly impacted by the current restrictions as well as any changes that may occur in the coming months. Whilst we are hopeful that some restrictions will be lessened it is also likely that they may become more restrictive so as a school we are taking a most cautious approach to the planning and conduct of our activities.

The events that we expect will be impacted will be our Kindergarten orientation processes, our school Presentation Assembly and our Year 6 Farewell. In our planning we are focussing on what is the most important aspects for our students firstly and how we can maintain the specialness and excitement around these events.

We are thinking at this stage we will conduct all our Kindergarten Orientation activities online. Whilst we are permitted to have the pre-schoolers onsite, parents are not permitted to stay. Whilst we value giving the children the opportunity to visit, we are concerned of having children we don't know, being upset and scared where we can't have their parents support and intervention. We believe that at the commencement of 2021 whilst conducting our Best Start interviews we can build some orientation activities into those days. We feel this will ensure a successful and smoother orientation. It will though require parents to be very open and transparent around any special needs their child may have when we conduct our zoom interviews over the next few weeks.

Our Presentation Assembly will be impacted around restrictions related to length of assembly time and not mixing cohorts. We are currently looking at running a Presentation Assembly for each stage with some form of broadcast available for parents to view. Our issues around filming and broadcasting are the students who do not provide permission to publish and the difficulties that this causes in the logistics of events. At Cambridge Gardens PS we believe that we shouldn't be excluding these students from the activities as these events are primarily for our children. Therefore there are at times issues around the filming and broadcasting of activities and whilst we do our best to provide the parent community with this connection it is not always possible or feasible.

Our Year 6 Farewell is probably the most trickiest one for us to negotiate around. Mr Hunter, Mr Kristof and myself are working very closely with the Year 6 students to provide a special event that our students will enjoy. Three factors heavily impact our planning for this event. One is that this year the students have been unable to fund raise throughout the year so activities that we would usually have funding for are now price prohibitive. Secondly, if we utilise a venue outside of the school, the students are subject to the restrictions that are in

place in the community and in place for venues. Things such as 10 to a table and no mingling and grouping together. These restrictions do not apply in the school setting. Finally, it also falls on school staff to police and manage community behaviour around grouping together at the commencement and end of the night which places our staff in a very difficult situation. Whilst we are always supported by our fantastic parents, as many of you would be aware at times at Year 6 farewells when extended families and friends and other community members attend it is often very difficult for our staff to deal with some of the behaviours and attitudes that we encounter from people we have little knowledge of, or a relationship with. Therefore we are intending to hold our Year 6 Farewell on the school site during the school day. We have a committee of Year 6 students working toward making this event what our students choose to make this a memorable day for them.

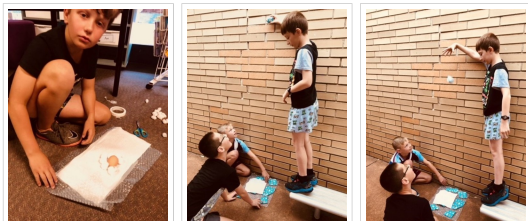
Sinatra's Science Adventures

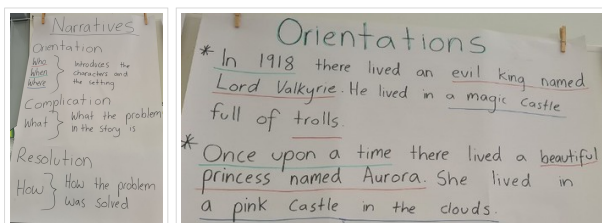

Good Reading Habits

10 WAYS TO ENCOURAGE GOOD READING HABITS

Try these 10 easy tips to encourage good reading habits in your child by making reading fun.

- 1. CREATE A READING AREA.**
Make an area for your child to read in with his or her help. Grab a bean bag chair, fun accessories, a variety of books, and your child will have his or her own cozy reading corner.
- 2. ENCOURAGE READING AT HOME AND EVERYWHERE IN BETWEEN.**
Teach your child that reading is more than just for books. Practice reading menus, movie names, road signs, game instructions, and more—show your child reading is everywhere.
- 3. SET AN EXAMPLE.**
Act as a role model and read in front of your child. Watching you reading magazines, newspapers, and books shows your child that reading is important. Encourage your child to join you with his or her own book while you are reading.
- 4. MAKE CONNECTIONS BETWEEN READING AND REAL LIFE.**
Help your child apply what he or she is reading to everyday life. Making connections between books and your child's own experiences can help increase his or her interest in reading.
- 5. KEEP READING MATERIALS IN THE HOUSE.**
Give your child easy access to books and other reading materials at home. This helps him or her understand that reading doesn't only happen at school—it can happen anywhere.
- 6. VISIT YOUR LOCAL LIBRARY.**
Making reading fun can be easy with a library card. Take advantage of the selection at your local public library by letting your child pick out a book that catches his or her attention.
- 7. TALK ABOUT WHAT YOUR CHILD IS READING.**
After your child has finished a book, talk about what happened and ask what his or her favourite part was. This will enhance your child's comprehension skills, and make reading a family activity.
- 8. EXPOSE YOUR CHILD TO DIFFERENT BOOK GENRES.**
Find a book that interests your child. Explore different genres like mystery, science-fiction, comic books, and more. The more interested your child is in a subject, the more he or she will be excited to read!
- 9. SUPPORT YOUR CHILD.**
If your child has difficulty reading and gets frustrated, take a step back and see where he or she is struggling. Talk with his or her teacher and address the issue as soon as possible.
- 10. READ EACH NIGHT.**
Make reading part of your child's night-time routine. This habit helps your child learn to associate reading with relaxation.
