Attendance Matters!

Last term, it was fantastic to see how many students had an attendance rate of 90% or above. Nearly 300 students reached the 90% target, with over 200 having a rate of 95% or above. The Department of Education has stated that the expected attendance rate is 95% for every child, so that's over half the school reaching our goal.

Instead of providing a reward to each child last term, we decided to reward the class with the best attendance rate overall. There were two lucky winners – Triassic class and Apollo class. Each student in those classes received an ice block as their reward in Week 10.

I wonder if your child can achieve an attendance rate of over 95% this term, and if their friends in their class can help get them over the line to be the winning class for term 4, 2023.

Each day here or there adds up very quickly. Missing school means your child is missing opportunities to learn and also to make those important social connections face to face. Poor attendance can also have long term impacts on a child's engagement in their learning and affect their mental health.



Let's make a big push to have every child at school every day they are well, joining in and having fun. How many can make the expected attendance rate of 95%? Which class will win this term?


Smiling Mind

Nutrition Snippet VEGIE AND PEPITA MUFFINS Serves: 12 Prep time: 15 mins Cooking time: 25 mins Ingredients 1 cup pumpkin, cut into 1 cm dice 3 spring onions, finely sliced

- 1 zucchini, grated & liquid squeezed out 1 cup baby spinach leaves, chopped
- 2 eggs 1 cup reduced-fat milk
- 1/2 cup sunflower oil 1 cup wholemeal flour 1 cup plain flour
- 2 tsp baking powder 2 tbsp pumpkin seeds

Salt & pepper

Method

Step 1: Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a muffin tray with muffin cases. Step 2: Place pumpkin in a microwave-safe bowl, cover with water and cook in the microwave for 3 minutes or until slightly softened. Drain and mash. Step 3: Add the zucchini, spring onions and spinach to the pumpkin and mix.

Step 4: Lightly beat together the eggs, milk and oil and pour over the vegetables. Season with a pinch of salt and pepper.

Step 5: Sift the flours and baking powder over the top and stir until just combined.

Step 6: Spoon the mixture into the muffin cases and sprinkle with pumpkin seeds. Bake for 25 minutes or until cooked through and golden




