As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$3.5 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

The 2023-24 Budget committed funding to progress with an upgrade to Cambridge Gardens Public School.

Cambridge Gardens Public School upgrade

These funds will help Cambridge Gardens Public School by delivering new and upgraded facilities, including upgraded playground surfacing, a basketball court and student restroom facilities.

The selection of surfacing will depend on the individual site and its needs. All new playground surfacing will comply with current Australian Standards.

Early planning has begun.





VEGIE AND PEPITA MUFFINS

Serves: 12 Prep time: 15 mins Cooki



Cooking time: 25 mins Ingredients

- 1 cup pumpkin, cut into 1cm dice
 1 zucchini, grated & liquid squeezed out
 3 spring onions, finely sliced
 1 cup baby spinach leaves, chopped
- 2 eggs 1 cup reduced-fat milk
- ½ cup sunflower oil 1 cup wholemeal flour 1 cup plain flour
- 2 tsp baking powder 2 tbsp pumpkin seeds Salt & pepper

Method

Step 1: Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a muffin tray with muffin cases.

 $\underline{Step~2};~Place~pumpkin~in~a~microwave-safe~bowl,~cover~with~water~and~cook~in~the~microwave~for~3~minutes~or~until~slightly~softened.~Drain~and~mash.$

Step 4: Lightly beat together the eggs, milk and oil and pour over the vegetables. Season with a pinch of salt and pepper.





- · How to better understand your child's emotional needs




