Principal's Report

Multicultural Public Speaking Competition

Last Wednesday a variety of students presented their speech in the annual Multicultural Public Speaking Competition. Mr Attard had the honour alongside Mrs Hetherington, to judge our speakers based on fluency, voice projection, audience engagement and content. I was so proud of all our participants and their ability to present their speech in front of such a large audience. I would like to take the time to congratulate all students who participated in the school-based competition for their efforts and commitment to the competition. Today, four of our winning students participated in the local final at Penrith Public School. I am very pleased to announce and congratulate all four students with a special mention to Mukun who was a winner in today's final!



Externally funded service providers

As a school we recognise that externally funded service providers may have a role in delivering services to children with additional needs to support their participation in school. In some circumstances it may be appropriate for these services to be delivered at school. Decisions around whether

to provide access to externally funded providers are a matter for the school principal, based on whether it is in the best educational interests of the student, and considering the school's duty of care towards all staff and students. Principals have the discretion to grant or not grant school access to an external provider, taking a range of important factors into consideration. These considerations include:

- The impact of the service on curriculum requirements and the student's participation in teaching and learning activities.
- The extent to which the service supports the student's learning needs or enhances access to education.
- The impact of the service on other students and/or the operations of the school.

Before a provider can deliver a service to students in a school, the provider must demonstrate that they have the necessary checks and training in place. It is important that any documentation relating to external providers is handed into the school office not the classroom teacher as approval is needed by the principal.

Stage 2 Excursion-The Royal Botanic Gardens

Today, the majority of our Year 4 students travelled to the Royal Botanic Garden in Sydney to take part in an excursion linked to their Science unit. I hear reports that all students and teachers have had an amazing time in the gardens and even got to plant their very own tree. Tomorrow, our Year 3 students will attend the excursion and I am sure they will have equally a wonderful time. Thank you to Miss Barbagallo, Mrs Williams and Mrs Hetherington for all your organisation.

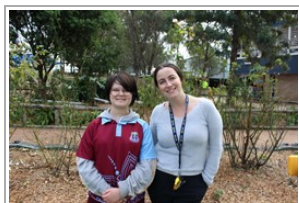

Dear Parent/Carer,

Cambridge Gardens Public School has been advised that members of the school community have recently tested positive to COVID-19. While testing and isolation is no longer mandatory for being exposed to someone with COVID-19 in school settings, NSW Health has provided advice on testing and isolation requirements for our school communities following [exposure to COVID-19](#) that should be considered when making decisions for your child and family if this situation arises at your school.

You are reminded that students and staff cannot attend school if they are showing any [symptoms of COVID-19](#). These include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection).

If symptoms occur at any time, your child should not attend school and should undertake a rapid antigen test. If the rapid antigen test is positive, your child should isolate as someone who has tested positive to COVID-19. If you cannot access a rapid antigen test, you can attend a PCR (nose and throat swab) through a GP referral.

You must register any positive test on the [Service NSW website](#) or [Service NSW app](#) so that you can be linked to important health care support and advice. Parents and carers are reminded to please ensure that you select your school name when prompted when registering a positive test for your child.

The safety and wellbeing of our students and staff across NSW are paramount at all times. As such, we will continue to ensure that all necessary health advice is closely followed. [If you require additional rapid antigen tests, please contact the front office on 4730 1201 who will organise some for you to collect.](#)


