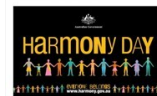

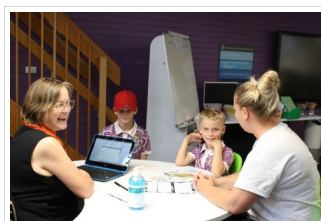

Nutrition Snippet

SAN CHOY BOW



Ingredients (serves 4)

1 tbsp canola oil
1 clove garlic, crushed
1cm ginger, crushed
½ carrot, finely grated
1 zucchini, finely grated
½ red capsicum, finely sliced
½ cup frozen corn kernels
400g pork mince
1 tin lentils, drained
2 tbsp oyster sauce*
½ lemon, juiced
2 spring onions, finely chopped
16 cos lettuce leaves

Method

Heat the oil in a large frypan or wok over medium-high heat until hot. Add the garlic and ginger and cook for 1 minute. Add the carrot, zucchini, capsicum and corn and stir fry for 1-2 minutes until soft. Remove from the pan.

Add the mince and cook until brown, breaking up the mince with a wooden spoon. Add the lentils and vegetables back to the pan and stir through.

Reduce heat to low, add the spring onions, oyster sauce and lemon juice and stir to combine.

Serve spooned into lettuce leaf cups.

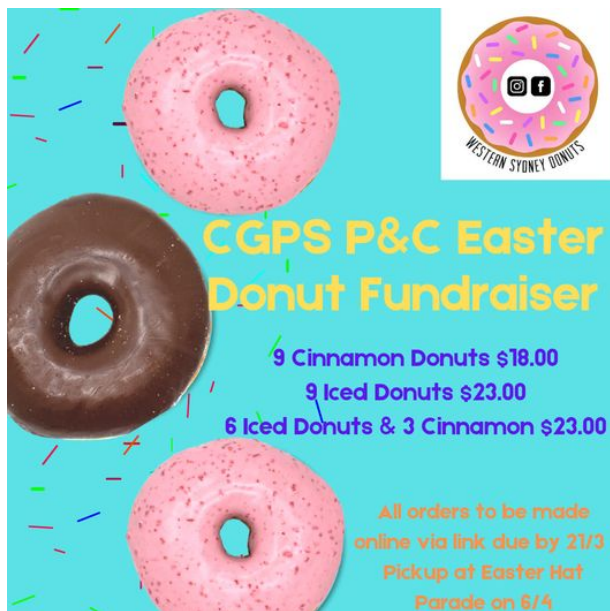

Hello, Cambridge Gardens Public School community. The team at Kids Pantry Canteens would firstly like to thank you for your support. It is great to see so many happy faces coming to the canteen every day. We really do enjoy seeing the smiles!!!

We would like to inform the community that we are currently experiencing some stock shortages from all our suppliers. This is a challenging time for all involved in the process and we are doing what we can to ensure that we have stock available to supply in the canteen. We appreciate your continued patience while we try and navigate through what we hope will be a short period of time. Further to this, our stock levels on the online store will be updated every week on either a Tuesday or Wednesday afternoon. Please keep this in mind when you are ordering for your children in advance.

Our team have also noticed that some online orders are being made after the 9AM cut off on the MySchoolConnect ordering system. We would like to remind you that the cut off time has changed from 10.30 AM to 9 AM every day. Orders that are made after this time automatically move to the next day and our team in the canteen may not see the order. If an order has been made after 9 AM please get in touch with the canteen to ensure that the order is prepared for the right day. The easiest way to ensure this does not happen, is to place an order before 9 AM.

1. REGISTER YOUR ACCOUNT

Register on any device, simply login to www.myschoolconnect.com.au and click on "Create Account", follow the prompts to add your email and password.

2. ADD YOUR STUDENT

And make sure that you select your school and classroom details.

3. SELECT "TOP UP"

To add money to your account via Credit Card or Paypal, you can choose Direct Deposit but allow 3-5 working days to process prior to ordering. You can also pay as you go, simply skip the pop up screen for adding funds and start ordering.
